Description

The ABTA Graduate Certificate in Intense Pulse Light & Laser Hair Reduction is designed for therapists who want to complete a Graduate Certificate are already professionals – and only want to get better. This course will help you excel by having these additional skills and knowledge.

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who apply substantial specialized knowledge and skills to design and safely apply non-ionising radiation treatments using intense pulsed light and laser technologies to reduce unwanted hair on the face and body. In this role they make complex, high level, independent judgments in:

- consulting with clients and analyzing their skin and hair characteristics
- designing and evaluating intense pulsed light and laser hair reduction treatment programs
- selecting and using appropriate technology, and applying it within the context of safe client and operator practices and in compliance with regulatory requirements.

Ongoing technological developments in this area of practice require the use of broad knowledge and the identification, analysis and evaluation of information from a variety of sources to build personal capability. Practice may be undertaken in the hair reduction stream of the beauty therapy or in other settings where cosmetic laser hair reduction services are offered.

To achieve a Graduate Certificate in Intense Pulse Light and Laser Hair Reduction, a total of 5 core units must be completed:

HLTINF402B	Maintain infection control standards in office practice settings
SIBBHRS705A	Apply intense pulsed light and laser safety protocols
SIBBHRS706A	Design intense pulsed light and laser hair reduction treatment programs
SIBBHRS707A	Provide intense pulsed light and laser hair reduction treatments
SIBBRES702A	Investigate developments in cosmetic treatments using light or laser systems

Pre-requisite and/or Co-requisite:

- Diploma of Beauty Therapy or a relevant qualification at diploma level or above in medical health, including the study of human biology, anatomy and physiology; and
- Significant and relevant vocational experience as a beauty therapist with a primary focus on providing facial services, skin services and hair reduction services; and
- Evidence of significant and relevant vocational experience relating to the application of human biology, anatomy and physiology knowledge in their respective field

Licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification consideration for the use of Class 4 Laser for cosmetic treatments is currently subjects to the following:

- Queensland Radiation Safety Act 1999, licensing of operator and premises
- Tasmanian Radiation Protection Act 2005, accreditation of equipment, premises and operator
- Western Australian Radiation Safety 1975, imposes conditions, limitations and restrictions on the use of Class 4 lasers.
- Other states and territories, no licensing, regulatory or certification requirements apply at the time of endorsement.

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Assessment includes

- Attendance record (class attendance)
- Practical exams
- Clinical practice (200 hours work experience practical hours)
- Assignment for each unit (Learning activities)

A range of teaching and learning strategies will be used to deliver this course, including face-to-face classroom delivery with some self-paced study projects, lectures, group work, role play, and projects based on real case studies. Practical work will be undertaken in a working laser clinic environment. The assessment methods used in the Certificate are competency based and include written and practical tasks. The assessment tasks are completed throughout your course of study.

The course carries a written workload dealing with complex concepts and students need to have sound literacy levels. Learners should be able to read and write English at approximately year 12 schooling or equivalent or relevant qualification or relevant vocation experience. All applicants will have an interview to assess their suitability for the course.

Course Duration and Completion Date

- Full time: (complete within 6 months)

5 days face-to-face intensive training session, plus 200 work experience practical hours, 1-day assessment

- Part time: (complete within 6 months)

2 evenings/wk for 5 weeks, plus 200 work experience practical hours, 1-day assessment

To graduate and receive your award certificate, you are required to complete all the course requirements within six (6) months after commencement date of the course in accordance with the ABTA Student Policies and Procedures.
